ASSIGNMENT - 1

Answer all the questions. Each question carries 20 marks

- 1. How can we apply animal behaviour knowledge to improve animal welfare and human-animal relationships? Discuss with suitable examples.
- 2. How can culture, economy and political systems within countries influence animal welfare? Illustrate with suitable examples.
- 3. Explain the main frameworks currently used to determine animal welfare requirements.
- 4. Discuss the concept, purpose and indicators of animal welfare assessment with examples.
- 5. Why is understanding ethics important in dealing with animal welfare? Discuss the consequential ethical approach and its application to animal welfare.

- 1. Differentiate between disbudding, dehorning and horn tipping. Write the arguments supporting and against these practices from welfare perspective.
- 2. Identify specific animal welfare issues in pig farming. Explain any four issues with welfare concerns and alternatives to improve welfare of pigs.
- 3. Differentiate between natural and forced moulting. Explain the economic reasons and welfare concerns in forced moulting in commercial hens.
- 4. Differentiate between Jallikattu and Kambala. Write the welfare concerns in bullfights.
- 5. Why good welfare of lab animals is so important? Discuss the major welfare issues in lab animals.

- 1. Differentiate between cognizable and non-cognizable offences. Discuss different offences against animals and relevant sections of IPC.

- 3. Discuss the salient features of Prevention and Control of Infectious and Contagious Diseases in Animals Act, 2009.
- 4. Describe the protocols and guidelines for the use of animals in research and testing.
- 5. Discuss the animal welfare concerns and salient features of the animal birth control (dogs) rules.
