ASSIGNMENT - 1 Animal Welfare Science and Ethics

Course Code: MAW-001 Maximum Marks: 100

Answer all the questions. Each question carries 20 marks:

- 1. What do you understand by animal welfare indicators? Critically differentiate between resource, management and animal based measures to assess animal welfare with examples.
- 2. What are the advantages of living in a social group? Discuss how abnormal social environments affect welfare of animals and ways to minimize them.
- 3. Why is sentience important in animal welfare? Discuss the behavioural studies that have been used as supporting evidence for animal sentience.
- 4. Discuss how fear and distress affects animal welfare with scientific rationality.
- 5. Why is animal behaviour one of the key attributes in welfare assessment protocols?

 Discuss different abnormal behaviour forms with examples.

ASSIGNMENT - 2 Animal Welfare Issues

- 3. Identify specific welfare issues in sheep and goat farming. Discuss any two issues with (a) welfare concern and (b) alternatives to improve welfare.
- 4. Discuss different poultry farming systems and related five freedoms with implications to welfare of poultry birds.
- 5. Browse the internet on Railways 'Plan Bee' to mitigate collisions between elephants and rains. Write your search results on (a) What is Plan Bee? (b) The Need for Plan Bee (c) How the Idea Emerged? and (d) Plan Bee Outcome(s).

ASSIGNMENT - 3 Animal Welfare Laws, Policies and Organizations

- 3. Search the literature available in the internet on Transport Rules of dogs and cats in at least two countries. Compare them with the transport rules of dogs and cats in India and write your observations.
- 4. Discuss the guidelines for the reuse and rehabilitation of laboratory animals and dogs.
- 5. What do you understand by the term enforcement agency? Write relevant sections and laws relating to animal cruelty.
