Man is a social being. Children live with their parents and in groups which are known as 'family', 'Community', 'society' and 'nation' Individuals as well as groups depend on one another to a large extent. This dependence and cooperation is possible only because they can interact and communicate with one another through words. A child learns to speak at home. It learns the meaning of words and, subsequently, the grammar of the language. Using this as a foundation, it acquires further knowledge from teachers and also skills of a specific trade.

At almost every stage there is an exchange of ideas between the child and the other members of the society. It is this ability to communicate with its parents, teachers, other children and grown ups which makes a human being so different from the other members of the animal kingdom. Aristotle had commented that one of the essential characteristics of man as a social being is his power of reasoned speech.

The story of human communication can be traced to the times when man had just evolved from his ape-like ancestors. As time passed, man became skilled in the use of tools to hunt and gather food. He learnt to shape effective tools such as the axe, knife and the spear. Their sharp edges were earlier made of flint. Subsequently, bronze or iron was used for the purpose. In the process of making and using such tools, man learnt to control the movements of his hands and fingers.

These skills provided him with a means to express his inner feelings. He began by drawing pictures on the walls of the caves in which he lived. An example of such drawings is the **Bhimbetka** caves in Madhya Pradesh. Among the other known cave-drawings are those of Covalaras (in Spain) which depict a group of deer that the early man hunted for their meat and skin. These pictures could have been drawn to teach children how to approach a deer during a hunt or just to brighten up homes. These drawings communicate to us the kind of life our ancestors led over 15,000 years ago.

Later, man gave up his nomadic life for a settled one. He took to harvesting crops and breeding domestic animals. With this change in his style of living, some new requriements came up. A need to record information such as who could cultivate and where; and also information related to property, taxes and /or so many other pieces of information. Later, the rules of social conduct and behaviour as approved by religious groups were also written down and these became our holy books.

The very first writings were mainly pictorial in nature. Each picture depicted the name of an object or some specific action associated with it.

It was only much later that the alphabet, as we know it today, finally evolved. Here, each symbol or a letter represents a specific sound. The words, whether they represent a name or an action, could now be written as a sequence of letters making their pronunciation quite specific. A person reading these sequences would understand their meanings. It was just as though the author is present infront of him and speaking to him directly. Thus, the ability to read and write became a powerful tool and an essential one in view of the increased inter-relationship among people.
