2. Briefly discuss the 'prosecution system' in India.
3. Explain framing of charge in warrant cases by Magistrate.
4. Discuss "Victim Compensation Scheme". envisaged in section 357A of the Cr.PC, 1973.

5. What are the Procedural safeguards available to the accused in India ?
6. Discuss Prison reforms in India after Independence.

### PART-B

Attempt *any four* questions in about **500 words**.

Each question carries **10** marks each. **4x10=40**

1. Examine the evidentiary value of the statements made to the Police during investigation.
2. "Remand order under Section 167 is a Judicial order. It has to be passed on application of mind to the contents of the remand report submitted by the investigating officer." Comment.
3. What are the various legislative provisions for protecting the rights of witnesses in India?
4. Do you agree with the view that the granting of anticipatory bail affects the investigational rights of the Police ? If yes, support your answer with reasons.
5. Explain the procedures to be followed by the Police while effecting arrest of an accused.
6. Write a note on release of offenders on probation.

### PART-C

Attempt *any two* questions in about 1200 words each. Each question carries 20 marks.  $2 \times 20 = 40$

1. What is dying declaration ? Explain the procedure to be followed in recording dying declaration.
  2. Critically examine the principles developed by the Courts for the protection of identity of witnesses.
  3. Discuss the role of Indian Supreme Court in evolving compensatory Jurisprudence for victims of crime in India.
  4. Write a critical note on living conditions of women prisoners in India.
