3. Compare and contrast the levels of decentralisation and development in various States in India. 20
4. "In India decentralisation seems to be working well in statutes and rules of business. There is very little translation of ideas into action." Explain. 20
5. "Decentralisation leads to more collaborative and co-operative form of governance." Elucidate with examples. 20

6. To achieve “Sustainable Development Goals” India needs to operationalise decentralised governance in full measure. Do you agree ? 20
 7. “Decentralisation without accountability has led to decentralised corruption and inefficiency.” Comment. 20
 8. Compare the decentralisation Models of Vth and VIth Schedule areas. Which of the two models do you think has been more successful ? 20
 9. Asynchronous decentralisation of responsibilities vis-à-vis authority has resulted in failure of real decentralisation of governance in India. Explain with empirical examples. 20
