- 1. What do you mean by the term 'scientific method'? Critically examine the fundamental differences between Popper's and positivists' views about the theory of scientific method. Do you think that Popper is a semi-positivist?
- 2. 'Social Research is conducted within theoretical and methodological perspectives.' Do you agree with this statement? Give reasons and illustration in support of your answer.

- 3. How will you make a choice of an appropriate sampling method? What are the alternative approaches of determining sample size? Explain.
- 4. 'Research design is a logical rather than logistical exercise.' Explain. Give illustration in support of your answer.

- 5. What is the distinction between quantitative methods and qualitative methods? Are the tools for data collection different under these two methods? Give examples.
- **6.** Explain the difference between any *three* of the following methods:
  - (i) Descriptive and Explanatory Research
  - (ii) Ratio Scale and Nominal Scale
  - (iii) Abduction and Retroduction
  - (iv) Random Sampling and Theoretical Sampling
  - (v) Mono Method and Mixed Method
- 7. What is multi-collinearity? How will you detect it and get rid of this problem?
- 8. Distinguish between questionnaire and interview as a tool of data collection. How will you frame a questionnaire to evaluate the impact of application of PowerPoint presentation in classroom teaching?

- **9.** Frame a research proposal of your own choice for conducting the study from critical theory perspective.
- 10. What is the distinction between Hypothetico-Deductive model and Covering Law model of scientific explanation? How does Hypothetico-Deductive model defuse the conflict between the realists and instrumentalists?
- 11. What kind of data is generated by NSSO on household expenditure? How is this data useful for analysis of poverty and inequality?
- 12. Given the regression model  $Y_i = \beta_1 + \beta_2 X_{2i} + \beta_3 X_{3i} + \beta_4 X_{2i} X_{3i} + u_i,$  where Y is the personal expenditure,  $X_2$  is personal income and  $X_3$  is personal wealth.
  - (i) What is meant by  $X_{2i}X_{3i}$  expression?
  - (ii) How would you test the hypothesis that the marginal propensity to consume (MPC) is independent of the wealth of the consumer?
- **13.** Explain the various steps involved in hypothesis formulation and testing.
