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(b) Hence loathed Melancholy of cerborus, and blackest mid-might born,In Stygian cave forlorn'Mongst horrid shapes, andShrieks, and sights unholy,

 A stately pleasure-dome decree:
 Where Alph, the sacred river, ran
 Through caverns measureless to man
 Down to a sunless sea.
- (d) Swift as a spirit hastening to his task

 Of glory and of good, the sun sprang forth

 Rejoicing in his splendour, and the mask

 Of darkness fell from the awakened Earth.

 - (d) William Blake
- 7. How does W. B. Yeats make use of history in his poems? Illustrate with examples from the poems in your course.
- 8. Critically evaluate any *one* of the following poems:
 - (a) 'Sordello at Mantua'
 - (b) 'The Blessed Damozel'
 - (c) 'I Remember, I Remember'
 - (d) 'Lady Lazarus'
