- (a) 'A', a businessman enters into an agreement 2 with 'B' an architect for construction of a building. However, the contract was terminated. 'A' approached another architect 'C' for construction of the building. 'C', without giving notice to 'B' enters into a contract for construction of the building. Discuss the correctness of 'C'S' action.
  - (b) A part of a building is damaged due to distress owing to water logging in the vicinity. Is the architect of the building responsible for the damage ? Explain.

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- (c) A dispute arises between a client and an architect with regard to interpretation of a clause in the 'conditions of engagement'. How can such a dispute be resolved ?
- (d) Can an architect sub-commission his work 2
  to another architect without informing his
  client ? Explain.
- (e) A client acts in violation of a provision in 2 the contract with the architect. What is the remedy available to the architect ?
- (f) A contractor refuses to commence work 2 after a letter of intent has been issued. How can this deadlock be resolved ?
- (g) Can a contractor seek for revision of rates 2
  due to prevailing increase in market rates ?

- (a) Are architects permitted to advertise their 7 professional services ? Explain.
  - (b) Is a certificate of registration necessary for 7 providing architectural services ? If a person falsely claims that he possesses a certificate, what are the legal consequences ?
- (a) What are the basic principles of Water 7 Conservation provided for in the National Building Code, 2005 ?
  - (b) Can an architect be held liable for 7 professional negligence ? Comment in the light of liability under law of torts.
- (a) You as an architect enter into a contract for 7 providing architectural services for an Urban Housing Project. Discuss the scale of charges involved and a tentative schedule of payment.
  - (b) A client approaches an architect for making 7 alterations in a building. Are such alterations exempt from statutory requirements? Discuss.

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- 5. (a) State the general exit requirements for safe 7 escape of occupants in a building in case of emergency.
  - (b) Describe the regulations relating to 7 'fire zones' provided in the National Building Code of India, 2005.
- 6. (a) Can the Council of Architecture initiate 7
  action against an architect for professional
  misconduct ? How ?
  - (b) A client approaches an architect for 7 constructing a building to be used for residential purposes. Briefly describe the scope of work involved and the preliminary stages in the schedule of services ?
- 7. (a) What is the role of board of assessors in an 7 architectural competition ?
  - (b) Discuss the tax implications for opening an 7 office of an architect.

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
