- 3. What is the importance of dialogue in revealing a 20 character's motivation? Illustrate your answer with suitable examples.

- 4. Distinguish between narrative story, and plot choosing any well-known story to illustrate your answer.
- 5. Write short notes on *any two* of the following in 150 200 words each: 10+10=20
 - (a) Humour in a short story.
 - (b) Anti-plot.
 - (c) Importance of motivation in a detective story.
 - (d) 'Ending' in an experimental story.

- 6. Write a short story about the change of heart of a criminal, ending with "I wish I had lived my life differently".
- 7. Write a dialogue between two students, one of whom believe's in cheating and the other who is trying to explain why it is wrong.
- Write a short story about a small child's first day
 at school. Your target reader is her/his peer
 group.
- Write a detective story about two aspiring detectives who try to solve a crime which they have only heard of Insert humour through dialogue/or situations.
- 10. Write a short story about a lonely ten year old child who has an imaginary companion. Your target readers are other ten year old children.
