Most people believe that children are the world's most invaluable resource and should be loved and cherished. However, since they are dependent on adults for their nurture and safety, they can neither look after themselves nor fight for their rights. Hence they are often maltreated and abused.

Many countries in the world are under-developed or developing countries. They can barely guarantee their children basic health, nutrition and shelter. Where then is time and opportunity for them to think about the rights of

their children or prevent their abuse? This is true of India too, to some extent.

We can think of three main reasons why child abuse in India is tolerated without even a murmur. One, in our tradition, elders in the family are given respect and unbounded authority and they can have their say in all matters concerning the family. Second, we believe in keeping family matters within the family and not let outsiders know of any problems in the family. Third, children are looked upon as the property of their parents. For these reasons, people are neither willing to talk about it openly nor report it to the authorities. Hence, the solution to this problem lies in spreading awareness. Since awareness is the only effective response to silence and denial, talking about this issue and making as many people as possible aware of it is the only way to deal with any violation of children's rights.
