Passage 1

The plants which man grows to provide food for himself and his animals must have water or they will die. This is because plant nutrients in the soil cannot enter the roots unless these have first been dissolved in water. Plants also need to absorb large quantities of water from the soil to build up their tissues. They need water also because they lose a great deal of water in the atmosphere each day as water vapour. This process by which land plants lose water vapour is call *transpiration*, a kind of breathing. In hot climates, more water is lost, and this loss must also be replaced from the water in the soil.

Rain supplies most of water that plants need, but unfortunately, it does not always fall at the right time of the year or in sufficient quantities. Plant may stay alive if rain is scarce, but they will not yield a good harvest of food.

Thus, for centuries, man has devised methods of supplementing natural supplies of water to his crops by means of irrigation. There are mainly two methods of irrigation: surface irrigation, and overhead irrigation. Each of these two main types has more than one method of supplying water. The method of irrigation used varies according to the climate, the crops, and the availability of water resources.
