Or
Write a detailed note on the utility of radio in Distance Education.

5. Write radio advertisements on all **three** of the following:
 - a) Any new invention
 - b) A new housing complex
 - c) A new restaurant(5x3=15)

6. Write a radio script for discussion on any **one** of the following:
 - a) Charity begins at home
 - b) Environmental pollution
 - c) Crime against women(5x3=15)

7. Script a radio play based on **one** of the following proverbs:
 - a) A stitch in time saves nine

- b) A bird in hand is worth two in the bush
c) All that glitters is not gold
