8. Discuss the Constitutional rights available to an accused.

9. Discuss the role played by the Indian Judiciary in the development of Compensatory Jurisprudence in India.
10. Discuss the provisions relating to the treatment of women prisoners during imprisonment.
11. Enumerate the provisions relating to the conduct of prosecution and withdrawal of prosecution by the Public Prosecutors as laid down in the code of Criminal Procedure.
12. Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of Plea Bargaining.

16. What is dying declaration ? Explain the evidentiary value of dying declaration.
