- 2. What are the basic skills that form reading readiness among pre-school children? Discuss with suitable examples the ways in which a pre-school child develops oral and narrative skills.

- 6. Before selecting a writing task for a primary level classroom, how would you analyse the 'language demands' and 'language needs' of the young learners?
- 7. Describe the skills and sub-skills of reading comprehension. Suggest the methods you would adopt to help your learners become better readers.
