- (i) What are the different ways in which a pre-school child develops oral and narrative skills?
- (ii) What are the symptoms displayed by children with developmental language disorders? What interventions can be made by the teacher to help such students with language learning?

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- (iii) Why is listening important for language learning at the primary level? How can a teacher motivate young learners to listen?
- (iv) What are the *two* major components of speaking skills?
- (v) Describe the *three* different approaches to reading. Give *one* activity each for teaching these.
- (vi) Discuss the important handwriting conventions that children need to follow.
- What do you understand by the term 'emergent literacy'? Explain how parents and teachers can promote emergent literacy.
- 3. What are the characteristics of underprivileged learners? What are the problems that they generally face in learning English as a second language?
- 4. How can a teacher create opportunities to use spoken English in the classroom? Briefly describe *six* types of activities that a teacher can introduce to encourage spoken English in the primary school.

- 5. What are the different types of grammar games/activities that a teacher can introduce in the primary classroom, to make grammar interesting? Give examples of each type. 20
- 6. What aspects should be considered while designing a listening task for assessment?

 Briefly describe the stages of a listening task.
- 7. What are the main aspects of a good writing programme? How can a teacher create a stimulating classroom environment which promotes writing?
