Note: The question paper has been divided into 3 parts. Part A, Part B and Part C. From Part 'A' you have to attempt any 4 questions. From Part 'B' you have to attempt any 4 questions and from Part 'C' you have to attempt any two questions. All the questions are compulsory.

PART - 'A'

Note: You have to attempt any four questions from this part. Each question carries 5 marks. 5x4=20 (not exceeding 200 words)

- 1. Explain the limitations on the powers of Police under section 155 Criminal Procedure Code.
- Explain the concept of "arrest" under the CRPC,
 1973 with the help of judicial decisions.
- 3. Discuss the rationale behind 'dying declaration' and explain its evidentiary value. How should it be recorded?

- 4. Write a note on the distinction between bailable and non-bailable offence. Also state the basic guidelines in exercise of judicial discretion while granting bail in non-bailable offences.
- 5. Write a note on the International trend on the subject of role of victims in criminal justice system and justification for compensation to victims.
- 6. Critically evaluate the prison system in India and suggests various reforms that is need to be carried out to achieve the object of reformation and rehabilitation.

PART - 'B'

Note: Attempt any four questions from this part. Each question carries 10 marks. 10x4=40 (not exceeding 500 words)

- 1. Explain essentials of First Information Report (FIR) and state the evidentiary value of FIR.
- 2. Discuss briefly the procedure to be followed by the investigating officer while effecting search and seizure under CRPC, 1973.
- 3. "Prosecuting agency should be separated from and made independent of administrative counterpart i.e. the police department". Comment.
- 4. Discuss the principles which should guide the court while framing in the charges under CRPC, 1973.
- 5. Discuss briefly the right against self incrimination under Article 20 (3) of the constitution.
- 6. Write a short note on the status and living conditions of women prisoners in India.

PART - 'C'

Note: Attempt any two questions from this part. Each question carries 20 marks. 20x2=40 (not exceeding 1500 words)

 Discuss the rights of the arrested person with special reference to constitutional guarantees in Part III of the constitution.

- 2. Discuss the role assigned to public prosecutor under the criminal justice system in India with the help of legal provision and judicial decision.
- Discuss the philosophy behind the enactment of the Probation of Offenders Act, 1958 bringing out the salient features of the Act. Also bring out distruction between "admonition" and "probation".
- 4. Name the various functionaries in the criminal justice system in India and bring out the role that the trial court is expected to perform in finding "truth" in a Criminal Trial.
