Organic food is being talked about everywhere, but since its cost is substantially more, it has not quite caught on. Does it make sense to spend the extra money? We try to answer this question. Here is what organic food has in its favour. Organic food is healthy and the decision

to adopt it is a wise one. When you are eating organic food you are not eating a concoction of synthetic chemicals like DDT, Dichloro-Diphenyl-Dichloroethane and BHC, Benzen Hexachloride, whose ability to alarm extends beyond their names to the effect they have on the health. According to experts, chemicals are added not to add value to the food, but to kill insects and pests. Organic food is not abused and is clean. In organic foods, pesticides are used only when needed and as a routine process. Only approved plant based organic pesticides are used most of which do not kill insects but make the taste of the food surface bad. Also they are biodegradable and get easily washed away.

Several studies have shown that organic foods have higher nutrient content. The quantity of flavonoids, which protect against coronary heart diseases, is higher in organic tomatoes than in conventionally grown ones. People also find organic foods tastier than the normal food. Organic foods can prevent diseases later on in life, if these are given to growing children because children are more susceptible to toxins than adults as their brain and immure system are in the process of getting developed and also because they take in more food per kilo of body weight than adults.

In spite of all these benefits, the availability of organic food is restricted in India. It is easy to get less perishable products like cereals, pulses, tea, spices and processed organic food like pickles and jaggery. Vegetables are available, though not as readily.
