2. Discuss the decision of the supreme court in Sheela Barse V. State of Maharashtra relating to legal aid to under trial and convicted prisoners.
3. What are the functions of After - Care Organisation ? Discuss.
4. What are the United Nations standard minimum rules for the administration of Juvenile Justice.
5. Discuss the Nuremberg principles.
6. What do you understand by the term hybrid model of international justice or a hybrid court ? Discuss.

PART - C

Attempt *any 2* questions from this part. Each question carries *20 marks*. 2x20=40

1. What do you understand by the term 'Child in need of Care and Protection' ? Is there a separate legislation in India for them ? Discuss.
 2. Explain the Procedural aspect in the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000.
 3. Discuss the mandate, subject matter of jurisdiction and provisions of International Criminal tribunal for Rwanda.
 4. Critically assess and evaluate the provisions of the National Security Act, 1980 with the help of decided cases.
